



# WAPSIE SUMMER CAMP COVID-19 PRECAUTIONS

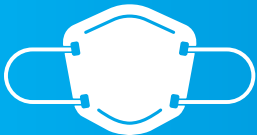


## COMMUNICATION

- Wapsie will notify registered camp families of check in procedures or other planned safety precautions prior to arrival at camp. Expect at least one email a month before and a week before session start date.

## HEALTH, SAFETY & SCREENING

- Camp strongly encourages up to date COVID-19 vaccination & boosters for all campers & staff.
- Families asked to sign waiver acknowledging the risk of COVID-19 and camp programming.
- Initial on-site health screenings will be performed when campers arrive at camp.
- Each camper and staff member will have regular temperature and symptoms checks.
- Campers encouraged to monitor for symptoms of COVID-19 the week prior to camp.
- Stay home if feeling ill, symptomatic or have tested positive for COVID until CDC guidelines permit to return to public.
- Unvaccinated individuals exposed to someone with COVID-19 will be sent home to quarantine.
- Anyone on site that exhibits COVID-19 symptoms or has a fever of over 100.4<sup>0</sup> F will be quarantined until a negative COVID test is received.
- Parent/guardians will be asked to pick up campers who test positive for COVID-19.
- Campers and staff will practice social distancing when possible. Activities may be done in smaller cabin/ program groups.
- Campers with a high risk of complications from COVID-19 infection, or w living with a high risk individual should consult with physician regarding attending camp.



## CHECK IN/CHECK OUT

- Families will be asked to limit bringing non-campers to check in and pick up times.
- Check in times will be staggered, families will be advised of camper's times.
- Facemasks will be encouraged at check in/out and encouraged when social distancing is difficult, except when sleeping, swimming and eating.
- Parents should pack several facemasks for their child to have available at camp.



## CLEANING & SANITIZING

- Living areas will be sanitized regularly and between groups. Other buildings will have cleaning and sanitization procedures based on on usage.
- Campers and staff will have regular access to hand washing and/or sanitizing supplies.
- Handwashing and sanitation stations are located around camp building and program areas/equipment for ease of access to campers.
